



The longneck women, well known for the **brass rings** they wear around their necks, are **Burmese refugees** living in Thailand. They originally fled Burma to escape the military regime, but since they arrived, Thai authorities have kept them in three guarded villages or **camp**s. The long-neck women are being held in **Thailand** because their unique appearance brings in revenue for the tourist industry. Tourists pay a fee to take pictures with the women and can buy weavings, carvings and other crafts during their visit. The money that is generated all goes to the **tourist** industry in Thailand, not the women themselves. This is just one way they are being kept in the camps. With **no income** of their own, they have no means to leave. The long-neck women do benefit from the purchase of these **Thai Longneck Scarves**.



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
